WHAT SHOULD MY CHILD KNOW WHEN?

As spring approaches and many parents begin to think about testing, those thoughts that often lurk in the back of our minds always lurch forward, causing moments of doubt and wonder: *Am I teaching my child(ren) everything they are supposed to know? How do I know I'm not missing something that might be important? How do I know what they should be learning?*

For homeschoolers in Washington, there is not a government-mandated list of details telling what our children must master. We enjoy the freedom to individualize our children's learning. What may be essential for one student to know in the future may be useless to another. However, many parents still seek the checklist of basics, to check up on what they have been teaching. So, here are some ideas, examples, and resources for those who wonder and want some reassurance to beat those thoughts back into the closet of the brain.

Annual testing offers one check-up for parents. The state has a list of approved tests for homeschooled students to take. Most standardized tests are similar, providing information on where the student ranks nationally among students in their grade. The most helpful information for parents is actual examination of the child's answers and the test itself, which will show the areas which have been mastered or need improvement.

In Washington State, an alternative to testing is a non-test assessment. More expensive and time-consuming, it is individualized and more appropriate for students who do not test well, have special needs, or are not yet reading.

Additional resources are also available. For families who are using a set curriculum, ask the company for a *Scope and Sequence*. This lists in summary form all the subjects covered in each grade level, according to that company's curriculum. Here are a few samples to look at:

I didn't find any of it to feel rushed or bland, and the overall message of the story was a perspective I hadn't considered before. The innocence and human behind what we called a "murderer." Truly, an incredible book.
